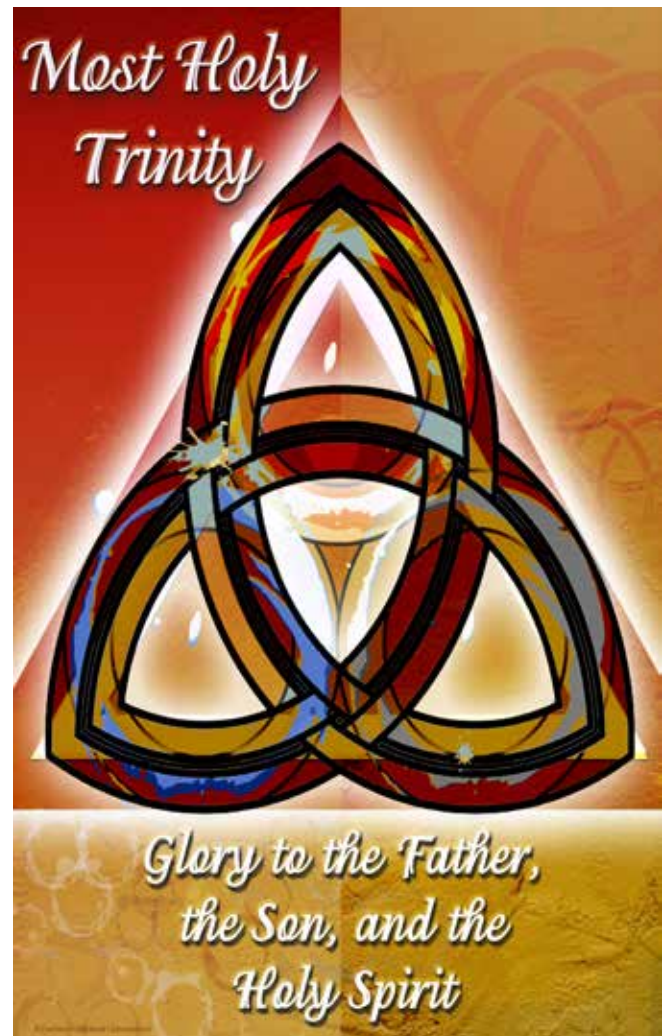

# Leading the FLOCK

## 'Priestly Jubilees, Ordinations and Vocations'

During these months of springtime, our own families and our parish families throughout the diocese have been celebrating with great joy the reception of the Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation. These are always moments of increased grace, enrichment of our Catholic faith, and the reminder of the vibrant disciples Jesus calls us to be. We have much to give thanks for as we witness so many of our children, grandchildren and family members receiving the Body and Blood of the Lord for the first time in the Holy Eucharist; or receiving the anointing with sacred Chrism, confirming in them the Gifts of the Holy Spirit and conforming them to Christ, the Son of God.

In these springtime days, our diocesan-wide family celebrates with great joy the graces of yet another Sacrament: Holy Orders! Earlier this May, once again, the members of our presbyterate gathered for the annual Mass on the Anniversaries of Priestly Ordination, offering thanks for the "gift and mystery" of the fidelity of those priest Jubilarians marking significant anni-

versaries: 25, 40, 50, 60 and 65 years! This year the Jubilarians represent a combined 575 years of faithful priestly ministry! We have much to give thanks for as we congratulate and pray for these good and generous priests who have so selflessly served the people of God. Later this month, our diocesan-wide family will celebrate with great joy the priestly Ordination of our three transitional deacons. On the Memorial of an extraordinary priestly model, Saint Philip Neri, we will celebrate their being configured to the very person of Jesus Christ the Priest, so they might minister in His name for the rest of their lives as joyful, prayerful, humble, chaste, zealous and obedient icons of Christ. We have much to give thanks for as we welcome these three new priests into our parishes, our hearts and lives.

In these springtime days, we also anticipate with hope an increased number of seminarians who will begin and continue studies in formation for the priesthood. Our Director of Diocesan Priestly Vocations has been working hard at encouraging a "culture of vocations" in order to assist

young men in hearing the call of the Lord to serve the Church and in responding to that call with a generous spirit. We have much to give thanks for as we nurture the men already engaged in priestly formation and as we recognize an increasing interest in priestly vocations.

Even as we rejoice in these jubilees, ordinations and vocations, the sobering reality this year is that we have no transitional deacons to be ordained, and therefore there will be no priesthood ordinations next year. Such a "drought" is a reminder of how intently we need to step up our prayers and work for priestly vocations, so that there will be priest Jubilarians for years to come, so that each year we might have a number of ordinations, and so that more and more young men will be caught on fire with the divine love which motivates hearts and minds to consider serving the Lord and His Church as a priest.

In these springtime days we have much to be grateful for – so I invite you – pray for and thank our priest Jubilarians or your own parish priest as he celebrates the anni-

versary of his priestly ordination. Pray for and thank our three transitional deacons who will soon be ordained priests and perhaps minister in your parish one day, who are about to lay down their lives to serve us. Come and bring family and friends to pray with and for them at the Ordination Mass in our Cathedral on Saturday May 26, 2018, at 10:00 am. Pray for and thank those who are pursuing a priestly vocation; and beg the Lord to grant us a new springtime of vocations, with young men heeding the Lord's call to offer Him their lives and having the courage, humility and generosity to say yes to serve the Church as a Priest of Jesus Christ.

For this we pray and for this we hope, as we entrust all these intentions to Mary, Mother of Christ the Priest, Mother of our priests.
