Public Rosary for Peace and Conversion



On October 13th at noon, Corpus Christi will be joining with 23,000 other groups throughout the country to pray a public rosary for the conversion of the United States from evil and for healing in the Church. We will gather in front of our church on Dorr St. to publicly witness to the need for prayer and Mary’s intercession for the evils within society and the Church.

Bethany House presents the annual **Unveiling Ceremony for the Northwest Ohio Silent Witness Project on Tuesday, October 9, from 7 to 9:30 p.m. at the Franciscan Center, 6832 Convent Blvd., Sylvania.** A national initiative, the Silent Witness Project honors and memorializes girls and women killed in acts of domestic violence perpetrated by husbands, boyfriends or stalkers. In the past decade, more than 55 such murders have occurred in our community.

The keynote speaker for this year's ceremony will be **Beverly Gooden**, survivor, advocate and creator of the viral hashtag #WhyIStayed, which was named by TIME magazine as one of the "Top 10 Hashtags That Started a Conversation." Gooden will draw on personal experience to address common misunderstandings about domestic violence, with an emphasis on factors that keep victims from being able to leave. She also will suggest strategies for raising public awareness about the lethal realities of domestic violence, and offer support and compassion for the loved ones of victims who did not survive.

Catholic Charities is hosting the ecumenical 40 Days for Life campaign in Northwest Ohio from Wednesday, September 26 – Sunday, November 4. You can participate in three ways: prayer and fasting, community outreach and peaceful vigil. We invite you to pray for an hour in front of Capital Care Network, the Toledo abortion clinic, located at 1160 W. Sylvania Avenue. Sign up at: www.40daysforlife.com/toledo.

Since the international 40 Days for Life Campaign began in 2007, over 750,000 volunteers in over 40 nations have stood in prayerful witness at abortion clinics to witness to the dignity of human life. Through these prayerful campaigns, over 14,000 lives have been saved, 177 abortion workers have quit their positions, and 96 abortion facilities have shut down!
