The past week at CCUP

— Toledo Backyard Mission —

You may have heard that 13 UT students and 11 Permanent Community Members, led by Father Jeremy, completed a four-day mission trip in the Toledo area January 9th - 12th. The inspiration behind this trip was to immerse students in poverty, to learn about the needs in our own community, and to unite students and permanent community together in service. Here's a look at what they did:

WEDNESDAY - The day began with a 25-minute experience in a cold and dark freezer to learn the conditions of homelessness in the winter. Working with a local pastor, the students were dropped off in downtown Toledo, given \$1 and told to go find a way (without their phones!) to access their email. In their email would be an "assignment" for the day. The students had to find lunch (for \$1 or less!) and sell the Toledo Streets newspapers.



THURSDAY - The day began at Helping Hands of St. Louis where the missionaries sorted clothes, repacked hygiene kits, and cleaned out the walk-in refrigerator. The group was able at the end of the morning to eat lunch with the regular guests at St. Louis. In the afternoon, the group tidied up Bethany House, a shelter for victims of domestic violence.



FRIDAY - The students spent the whole "day in the life" of a local "squatter," who is an unoused person who occupies abandoned places for residence. He shared some of his published poetry and broke down many of the stereotypes



associated with poverty. On Friday night, the group made lunches with Food for Thought and discussed how to combat the systemic nature of poverty.

SATURDAY - The group helped cook and serve pancakes at Just Pancakes - a ministry run out of Salem Lutheran church on the North end. They make up to 3,000 pancakes in one day, both for people to take home and eat on site. The after-



noon was spent at Sunshine, doing various activities with the residents there, many of whom have severe mental and physical disabilities. In the evening, a delicious meal was served for all who had participated in the four-day mission. There were many stories and lessons shared!

— Jason Evert Speaks at UT —

Over 200 UT students attended a talk by renowned Catholic chastity speaker Jason Evert. This event was hosted by CSA in the Student Union Auditorium on Campus on the first day back from break. Jason gave a talk titled "**How to Save Your Marriage Before You're Married.**" He gave students advice on how to date and six strategies to build lasting love.
