

From the Pastor...

However we get to the tomb, we belong there!

In the gospel we hear every Easter morning, Peter and John run to the tomb, with John running faster than Peter. This could reflect John's excitement to see Jesus, who had seen John last at the cross as the one apostle who stayed with him to the end. Peter's slow run to the tomb may reflect his hesitation to see Jesus, given that his last encounter with Jesus was after his third time denying that he even knew him. We might ask ourselves: Who was more ready to see Jesus, Peter or John?

The good news, though, is that both Peter and John have a place at the tomb. **Both the faithful John and the ashamed Peter found a home at the place of the Lord's resurrection.** In our own lives, we might reflect that we can better identify with Peter or John in this past year. Maybe like John we have been faithful to the Lord, put him first in our lives, and carried our various hardships with grace. Maybe we've been more like Peter, drifting from the Lord due to fear or embarrassment. Maybe we see ourselves as a mixture of the faithfulness of John and the infidelity of Peter.

However we get to the tomb, we belong there. We have a place at the empty tomb. Let us surrender our lives more fully this Easter to the one who conquers sin and death and secures our place in the empty tomb of everlasting life.
