Annual Parish Report

Friends,

I am pleased to present to you the annual report of our parish. Each year, we are required to publish an annual report for the sake of transparency and as a barometer of our vitality as a parish.

We've accomplished so much in this past year due to your incredible generosity:

- Student ministry continues to grow in numbers and activities
- Permanent community is engaged in a number of educational, social, and service-oriented opportunities
- New initiatives, such as children's ministry and more adult faith formation
- Building updates and repairs, such as LED lighting in the worship space and Newman Rooms and Zak Lounge renovation

Thanks to your support, all of this was accomplished while increasing our income and decreasing our expenses in this past year. Our bottom line numbers are not as positive as the year before due to fluctuations in the stock market, which impact our endowment accounts. We are in a really good position in terms of operations; but of course, our future needs remain significant as we manage growing student needs and capital repairs and improvements.

The Parish Statistics below show that our parish continues to be strong with new parishioners and consistent sacramental participation. The Finance Report has a different format this year, which we hope makes our financial situation more accessible.

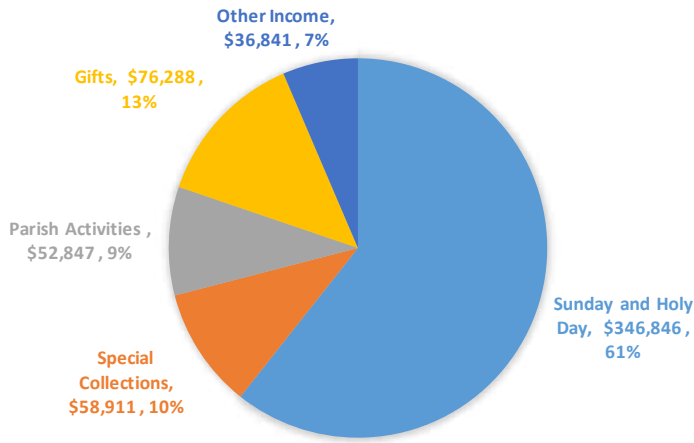

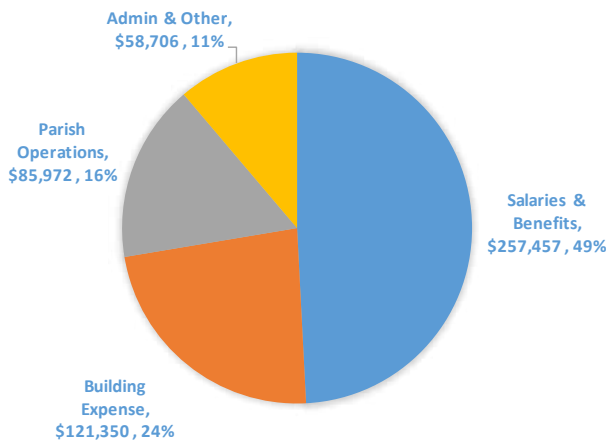

OPERATING INCOME - \$571,734



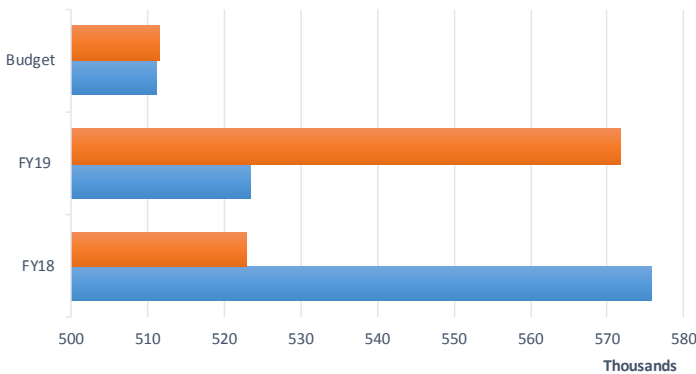
This chart shows the primary sources of revenue that support the operations of the parish. This is the money we have to pay the bills.

OPERATING EXPENSES - \$523,485



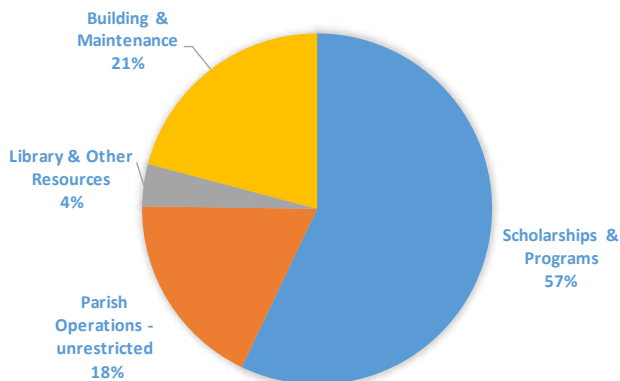
This chart shows the major ways the parish spends the donations that come in. These are the major costs incurred to provide all the services CCUP offers.

Actual expenses were significantly lower than last year, but higher than budget. The result was moving from a net loss in FY18 to a net profit in FY19.

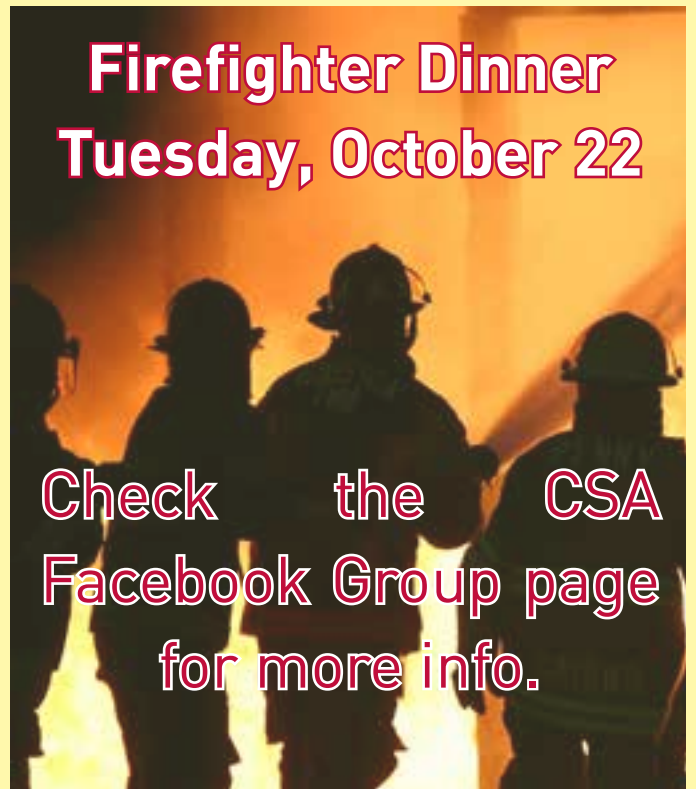
