Regaining the Momentum - Annual Parish Report

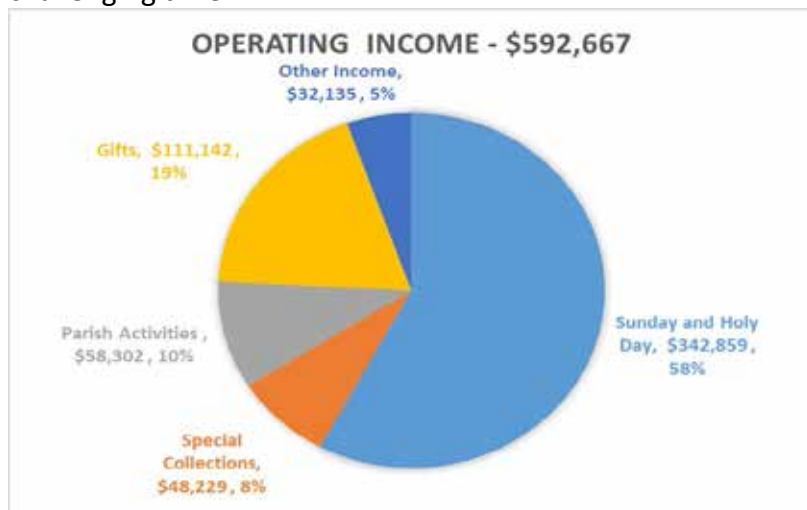
July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020

Friends,

I am pleased to present to you the annual report of our parish for the fiscal year ending in June. Each year, we publish an annual report as a barometer of our vitality as a parish.

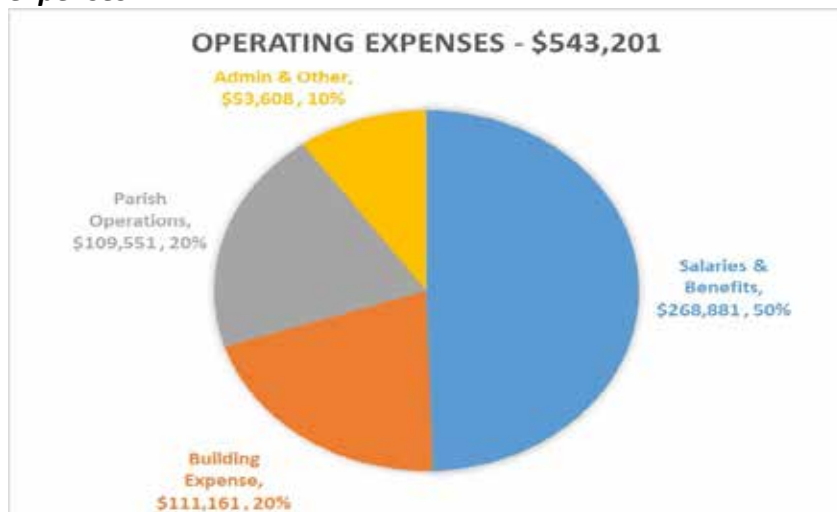
This year, I'm entitling our report: Regaining the Momentum. As we celebrate our 50 years as a parish this year, we are remembering the incredible legacy which laid such a strong foundation of ministry here. Leading up to the COVID shutdown in March, our parish was continuing to grow in both student and permanent community engagement. I mentioned in a homily this summer that for a brief time during the pandemic I was having a "pity party" because COVID seemed to have halted our momentum. I'm confident, though, we can regain that momentum in the months and years to come.

Even with the shutdown in March, April, and May, **our operating income increased 3% this past year.** You have been incredibly generous before the pandemic and have stepped up in an incredible way during this challenging time.



This chart shows the primary sources of revenue that support the operations of the parish. This is the money we have to pay the bills.

With increased programming and continued maintenance and improvement of our building comes extra spending. While our operating expenses were higher than the prior year, they are lower than our operating income. Thus, for the second year in a row, **our operating income has outpaced operating expenses.**



This chart shows the major ways the parish spends the donations that come in. These are the major costs incurred to provide all the services CCUP offers.

This chart allows you to see operating income and expenses compared to budget projections. ***Our expenses were slightly below budget and our income surpassed our budget estimate.***



We are blessed at our parish to have endowment funds that have been generously supported and wisely invested over the years. These investment funds include the Christian Leadership Program, Lura Lovell Fund for Building & Maintenance, Stephen Lovell Library Fund, Newman Scholarship Fund and the Parish Long Term Fund. Fortunately, over the last two years, we have not needed to pull from most of these accounts due to our good financial situation. However, due to the stock market fluctuations, our invested funds showed a loss. Since this loss was greater than our surplus in operations, we had a net loss for the year in our bottom line numbers.

Our parish remains strong even in spite of the setbacks due to COVID (see parish statistics on the next page). As we celebrate our 50th anniversary as a parish in the midst of a pandemic, I'm hopeful that we can regain the momentum that has been part of this parish since its founding. It would be reasonable to expect a difficult financial year given our limited in person Mass attendance and the challenging financial position that so many people find themselves in. I will keep you updated about our financial situation as the year progresses.

I want to thank Deacon Bob Fedynich and our wonderful Finance Council for all their work on behalf of our parish in this past year. The council members are: Mike Pniewski (Chair), Sandy Luetke (Vice-Chair), Patty O'Toole (Secretary), Ed Ciecka, Dick Torchia, Rachel Fitzpatrick (since left council), Steve Brookover, Joe Sweeney, and Jamie Monagan. Non-voting members include myself, Pam Meseroll (facilities representative), and Deacon Bob Fedynich.

When COVID settles down, let's regain the momentum that makes CCUP feel like home for students and permanent community alike.

Covid Updates for Mass Attendance

General Considerations

- **Attendance at weekend Mass continues to be optional.**
 - If you are feeling sick or showing COVID-19 symptoms, please refrain from attending Mass.
 - Live-stream of the 11 a.m. Mass will continue for those who remain at home.
- **We can *mitigate* risk but not *eliminate* it.**

Before you arrive...

- **Mass Schedule for Fall Semester:**
 - **Saturday - 4:30 p.m. - No music**
 - **Sunday - 9:00 a.m. (Temporary Mass time during the pandemic); 11:00 a.m. & 6:00 p.m.**
- Daily Masses will be held in the main church - **M,W,F at 12:05 p.m.** and **Tuesday at 8 p.m.**
- We are discontinuing the use of the paper sheets on chairs since our attendance numbers will continue to increase. With growing numbers, sanitizing all the chairs makes more sense going forward.
- **Masks/Face-Coverings** are mandated at CCUP so long as the state mandate remains in effect or Lucas County remains in the Level 3 warning zone. If someone is not wearing a mask, we should assume they meet one of the medical exemptions.
 - Disposable masks will be available at Mass if you'd like one.
- **The Bulletin** will be available when you enter church and will include the music for the day's Mass.
 - Bulletins will continue to be emailed and available on our website.

When you arrive...

- **Secure collection boxes** are available near the baptismal font for all donations/weekly offerings. Collection baskets will not be passed during the Mass.
 - Opportunities for Digital Giving (through PayPal, Credit Card, and Venmo) are available on our website.
- **Sitting arrangements** - Ideally, we are trying to keep two chairs between individuals or groups that live together. If you want to ensure that two seat separation, feel free to leave a bulletin or other personal items on two chairs away from you. If you don't mind someone sitting closer to you, less spacing is required.

During Mass...

- No Offertory **Presentation of Gifts**. The **Our Father** will continue to be prayed without holding hands. The **Sign of Peace** will continue to be suspended. The distribution of the **Precious Blood** is suspended.
- The **Communion line** will be single file based on section. Fr. Jeremy will announce instructions before Communion. Tape will be on the floor to ensure social distancing.
- Communion will continue to be available at the East Door during the 11AM Mass. For those who want to take advantage of this option, please watch the livestream from your car, then approach the side door during the singing of the "Lamb of God."
- For those wishing to **receive Communion on the tongue**, please go to the priest's Communion line and wait until all others have received. If you do not wait until all others have gone through the line, please be aware that the priest will use sanitizer after distributing communion to you on the tongue.

When you leave...

- **Please try to stagger leaving after Mass to avoid congregating.**
- **Congregating in the Gathering Space** after Mass should be limited at this time. Please feel free to congregate in the parking lot according to social distance recommendations.
 - Recycling bins will be available in the gathering space to **dispose of bulletins if you don't want to take them home.**
- **At 6pm Mass** - for those not staying for the Student Dinner, it is recommended that you leave during the closing song to avoid a bottle-neck with students waiting in line for dinner.
