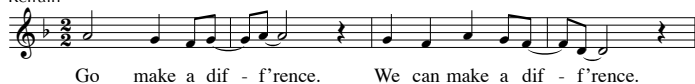

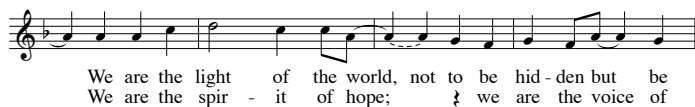

NEW STUDENT RECEPTIONISTS STARTING THIS MONTH

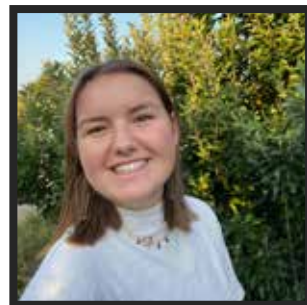
