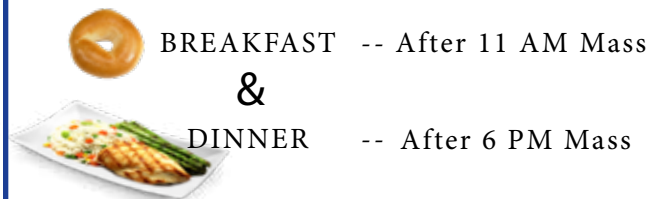

Covid Update

Friends,

We continue to journey through this difficult pandemic together. While it seems that there is light at the end of the tunnel, we strive to remain vigilant and minimize risk as best as we can.

We were fortunate to have a “somewhat normal” semester with our students in the fall. They were able to gather together in safe ways, build and strengthen relationships, outreach to the community through service, and grow spiritually. I’m so proud of how they succeeded in taking both physical and emotional health seriously in their fall programming. We hope to continue that same spirit in the spring semester.

Below is simply a restatement of some of the COVID procedures that we have become accustomed to here at CCUP. Nothing new. As we advance with the level of vaccinations in the months to come, I look forward to slowly introducing some things back like holy water and hymnals. Other things, like masking, seat spacing, the sign of peace, and the communion cup will probably follow more the relaxation of health department guidelines. We certainly all look forward to the day when we can worship at CCUP again without thinking about COVID!

- **Attendance at weekend Mass continues to be optional.**
 - If you are feeling sick or showing COVID-19 symptoms, please refrain from attending Mass.
 - Live-stream of the 11 a.m. Mass will continue for those who remain at home.
- **Mass Schedule for Spring Semester:**
 - **Saturday - 4:30 p.m. - No music**
 - **Sunday - 9:00 a.m. (Temporary Mass time during the pandemic); 11:00 a.m. & 6:00 p.m.**
- **Masks/Face-Coverings** are mandated at CCUP so long as the state mandate remains in effect. If someone is not wearing a mask, we should assume they meet one of the medical exemptions.
 - Disposable masks are always available at Mass if you’d like one.
- **The Bulletin** will be available when you enter church and will include the music for the day’s Mass.
 - Bulletins will continue to be emailed through Flocknote and available on our website.
- **Secure collection boxes** are available near the baptismal font for all donations/weekly offerings. Opportunities for Digital Giving (through PayPal, Credit Card, and Venmo) are available on our website.
- **Sitting arrangements** - Ideally, we are trying to keep at least one chair between individuals or groups that live together. If you want to ensure that separation, feel free to leave a bulletin or other personal items on chairs next to you. If you don’t mind someone sitting closer to you, less spacing is required.
- Communion will continue to be available at the East Door during the 11AM Mass. For those who want to take advantage of this option, please approach the side door during the singing of the “Lamb of God.”
- For those wishing to **receive Communion on the tongue**, please go to the priest’s Communion line and wait until all others have received. If you do not wait until all others have gone through the line, please be aware that the priest will use sanitizer after distributing communion to you on the tongue.

Sunday Night Student Dinners

It has been a long-standing tradition at CCUP to serve a home-cooked meal to students after the conclusion of the 6PM Sunday Mass.

We are in need of new teams of parishioners to fill the need this semester due to many veteran teams opting to pause volunteering until after COVID...

Who:

Groups of parishioners form into cooking teams to make dinner for the students. Some teams have been volunteering for years, making a meal each semester. Other teams have formed only recently.

New parishioner teams and/or individuals who would like to be on a team are always needed.

When:

Kim Kunkle schedules one team per weekend per semester to cook for the students.

Typically there are 14-15 dinner teams needed per semester!

Many teams use the CCUP kitchen to prep and cook their meal on Sundays.

Either the team serves the meal after Mass is dismissed (typically around 7pm) or the meal is self-serve, buffet style (*this option has become more popular due to COVID-19).

Dishes from dinner prep and the meal itself are done by a separate team of volunteers!

What:

Dinner teams donate all the food for the meals and CCUP provides lemonade and all dinnerware (i.e. cups, silverware, plates, napkins, etc.)

Parishioners cook a wide variety of menus - from soup and salad, to Italian night, to a baked potato bar!

Students will eat anything and everything - they appreciate having a meal outside the UT cafeteria that reminds them of home!

Where:

Dinner typically is served buffet style right outside the sanctuary doors in the Gathering Space & students eat in a variety of spaces throughout the building.

Why:

Dinners offer a unique opportunity for students to interact with Permanent Community members - the quickest way to a college student's heart is through their stomach!

This event keeps students in our doors and gives staff and student leadership time to interact with them and form lasting connections.

If you're used to giving via

PayPal

- We now have the ability to accept **one-time gifts & recurring payments.**
- If you are already making a recurring payment through PayPal, consider switching over to Givebutter so that **CCUP can receive your total gift** (vs. 3% being taken by PayPal)
- Givebutter also **requests a tip** to keep their fees at 0% so we don't pay anything for their platform!

If you're used to giving via

Venmo

- You can still give via Venmo, but **through Givebutter** vs. through the Venmo app.
- The Venmo app is not designed for non-profits, but **giving through Venmo on Givebutter IS!**
- Giving through Venmo is also a way to make sure **100% of your donation** comes to the parish by processing fees being included in your transaction.
