Covid Update

- **Attendance at weekend Mass continues to be optional.**
 - If you are feeling sick or showing COVID-19 symptoms, please refrain from attending Mass.
 - Live-stream of the 11 a.m. Mass will continue for those who remain at home.
- **Mass Schedule for Spring Semester:**
 - **Saturday - 4:30 p.m. - No music**
 - **Sunday - 9:00 a.m. (Temporary Mass time during the pandemic); 11:00 a.m. & 6:00 p.m.**
- **Masks/Face-Coverings** are mandated at CCUP so long as the state mandate remains in effect. If someone is not wearing a mask, we should assume they meet one of the medical exemptions.
 - Disposable masks are always available at Mass if you'd like one.
- **The Bulletin** will be available when you enter church and will include the music for the day's Mass.
 - Bulletins will continue to be emailed through Flocknote and available on our website.
- **Secure collection boxes** are available near the baptismal font for all donations/weekly offerings. Opportunities for Digital Giving (through PayPal, Credit Card, and Venmo) are available on our website.
- **Sitting arrangements** - Ideally, we are trying to keep at least one chair between individuals or groups that live together. If you want to ensure that separation, feel free to leave a bulletin or other personal items on chairs next to you. If you don't mind someone sitting closer to you, less spacing is required.
- Communion will continue to be available at the East Door during the 11AM Mass. For those who want to take advantage of this option, please approach the side door during the singing of the "Lamb of God."
- For those wishing to **receive Communion on the tongue**, please go to the priest's Communion line and wait until all others have received. If you do not wait until all others have gone through the line, please be aware that the priest will use sanitizer after distributing communion to you on the tongue.

CLP Retreat

Last weekend, our third year students in the Christian Leadership Program (pictured to the right) led our annual retreat for the CLP students in the other years. They did an incredible job encouraging our students to grow in the three pillars of the CLP Program - Spirituality, Leadership, and Service.

CLP is a four-year scholarship program developed by Fr. Bacik that provides theological and spiritual formation to students of the University of Toledo. Twelve freshman are selected each year. Throughout their time here, they take theological education classes, attend spiritual retreats, develop a habit of service, and seek leadership positions in campus organizations.

Spiritual Resources for the Week



Reflect

First Reading

Moses was unique among the prophets of the Lord because he spoke to God “face to face” (Ex. 33:11). Moses promises a prophet like him will arise to speak definitively to God’s people. Jesus, who intimately exists with God “face to face,” speaks with this kind of divine authority in the gospel today.

Second Reading

Some of St. Paul’s instructions here seem to be tied up in the concern that the Lord’s return was imminent. His broader principle of detachment, however, remains perennially relevant. While many aspects of vocation, career, and life in general are necessary responsibilities, St. Paul warns us about being so preoccupied that we are distracted from the priority of love of God and love of neighbor.

Gospel

One interesting feature of Jesus’ interaction with the demons in the gospels is that the demons seem to possess “faith.” They know who Jesus is as the “Holy One of God.” What they lack is the kind of trusting faith that leads to deep love. May we always strive to “know Jesus” more than we “know about” Jesus.

Upcoming Feast Days

Tuesday, Feb 2 : The Presentation of the Lord

Wednesday, Feb 3 : St. Blaise

St. Blaise served as the Bishop of Sebastea and was a doctor. It is said that St. Blaise often helped people with issues in their throats and also become known as a “physician of souls”. In 316 he was arrested for being a Christian. On the way to jail, a woman set her son who was choking on a fish bone before St. Blaise’s feet and he cured her son. St. Blaise was later beheaded because he refused to renounce his Christian faith. (catholic.org)

Friday, Feb 5 : St. Agatha

St. Agatha devoted her life to Christ at a young age and became a consecrated virgin. When Agatha refused the request to marry from one of her suitors, he had her arrested for being a Christian. St. Agatha was tortured and later had a vision of St. Peter, who healed her wounds through his prayers. After more torture Agatha died saying, “Lord, my Creator, you have ever protected me from the cradle; you have taken me from the love of the world, and given me patience to suffer: receive now my soul.” (catholic.org)

Saturday, Feb 6 : Sts. Paul Miki & Companions

Saints Paul Miki and Companions were among the 26 missionaries in Japan, martyred for proclaiming the faith. (Franciscanmedia.org)
