Spiritual Resources for the Week



Reflect

First Reading

Though the story of Noah is certainly filled with mythic elements, the message is God's disposition toward finding that which is redeemable in human beings. Just like we might grow cynical and jaded regarding the human capacity for evil, God seems to have reached the end of His rope at the time of Noah. However, the faithfulness of Noah's family was enough to secure a future. God's desire for new beginnings is the key to the Noah story.

Second Reading

Noah's protection from the flood waters is seen as a prefigurement of baptism. For us as Catholics, baptism is salvific because it is an entrance into the saving death and resurrection of Jesus. God can work outside the bounds of the sacraments, but He still invites us into the drama of the Paschal mystery through the cleansing waters of baptism.

Gospel

Mark's account of the temptations is much less detailed than the parallel versions in Matthew and Luke which we are probably more familiar with. I would invite you to use this vacuum in Mark's version to supply the temptations. Visualize the temptations you battle and picture Jesus conquering them. Jesus' faithfulness in the midst of temptation is what gives us the confidence that we can overcome our demons.

Upcoming Feast Days

Sunday, Feb 22 : Saint Peter's Chair


On the Feast of Saint Peter's Chair, what we are celebrating isn't actually the piece of furniture, but rather the "role and office of Peter within the Church." This "office" has been around for 2,000 years and serves as a source of authority and unity. On this feast we celebrate Pope Francis's role as the shepherd of the Universal Church. The chair of Peter refers to the pope as "bishop of the world-wide Church". On this feast we also celebrate the authority that Jesus gave to the universal bishop to guide the Church on Earth. Let us rejoice on this feast celebrating the authority of our Catholic faith and pray for Pope Francis as he guides the Church!



Wednesday, Feb 23 : Saint Polycarp



Saint Polycarp was the bishop of Smyrna and a disciple of John the Apostle. He was also a friend of Saint Ignatius of Antioch. Only one of the many letters that Polycarp wrote has been preserved, the one he wrote to the Church of Philippi in Macedonia. At the age of 86 Saint Polycarp was led into the stadium in Smyrna to be burned alive. To everyone's surprise, the flames did not harm him! The Lord protected him from them. When the fire did not work, he was later killed by dagger and a centurion ordered that his body be burned. "The "Acts" of Polycarp's martyrdom are the earliest preserved, fully reliable account of a Christian martyr's death." He died in 155.

From Pope Francis's 2021 Lenten Message...

Prayer I "Through recollection and silent prayer, hope is given to us as inspiration and interior light, illuminating the challenges and choices we face in our mission. Hence the need to pray (cf. Mt 6:6) and, in secret, to encounter the Father of tender love."

Fasting I "Fasting, experienced as a form of self-denial, helps those who undertake it in simplicity of heart to rediscover God's gift and to recognize that, created in his image and likeness, we find our fulfillment in him."

Almsgiving I "Love is a gift that gives meaning to our lives. It enables us to view those in need as members of our own family, as friends, brothers or sisters. A small amount, if given with love, never ends, but becomes a source of life and happiness."
