- **Veterinary Scholarship:** \$ 1,000 for a UT senior registered at Corpus Christi



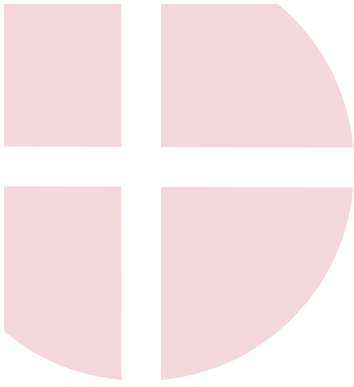

Reflect

First Reading

God often works through non-believers in the Bible, like Cyrus the Persian king, to accomplish His purposes. It is a reminder to us that God's Spirit is operative even outside the bounds of what we expect. God speaks to us "early and often" in the usual places and faces but also in places and faces that surprise.

Second Reading

Even though we as Catholics put a high priority on good works and our contributions to salvation, St. Paul cautions us against thinking that we initiate the relationship that saves us. It is God who always acts first and then invites us to RSVP with a life of faith and good works performed with his grace working through us.

Gospel

The serpent that Moses erected in the desert did not protect the Israelites against snakes (Numbers 21:9), but offered them a remedy from the effects of the snake bite. Similarly, the Cross does not guarantee we won't encounter sin and death, but rather it's the pledge that they have no eternal power. "For God so loved the world" is the enduring message of what Jesus suffered on our behalf.
