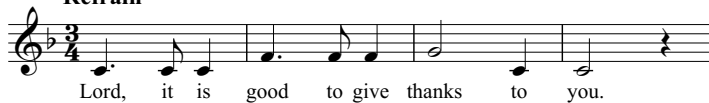

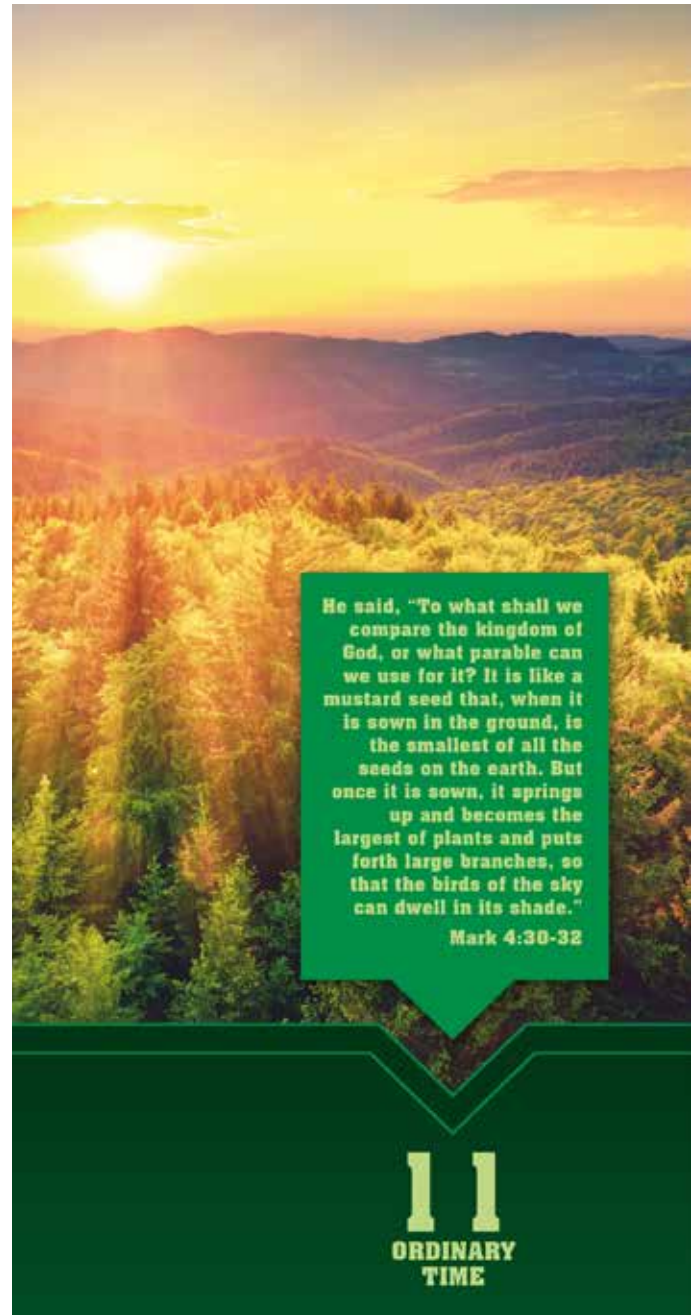

COVID Update

As of June 12-13:

- The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass is lifted.
 - *Those who have a serious reason, the sick and infirmed as well as those with pre-existing conditions, those who are incapable of physically attending Mass, and those who care for someone who is immuno-compromised are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. They should, however, make every effort to watch a broadcast of Mass from their homes.*
- Since the mask mandate is lifted statewide, masking at Mass is optional.
- Half of our church is returned to normal seating while the other half remains socially distant seating.
- Presentation of the gifts by the faithful will resume at the 11 a.m. Mass.
- The sign of peace is resumed though the personal preferences of those around you should be respected.
- The in-church communion distribution procedure at 11 a.m. Mass will go back to pre-pandemic style with 2 lines coming forward on each side simultaneously.
 - The goal of having one line per side during the pandemic was in an effort to minimize contact of one person with another.
 - However, now, it seems having one line with two distributors is leading to confusion and necessitates the crossing of one another's paths.
 - Returning to two lines simultaneously will limit confusion and lead to better flow during Communion.
- Reception of the Precious Blood will not resume at this time. (It likely will resume at the start of the fall semester in late August.)
- Reception on the tongue is no longer restricted to the end of the communion line.
- Most liturgical ministers (servers, lectors, etc.) are no longer required to wear masks. Eucharistic ministers are required until further notice.
